## Poster Previews

Just prior to each poster session, presenters are requested to give a brief synopsis of their poster content. The purpose is to give audience members a general idea of your research area and generate interest in your work for the poster session to follow.

Focus on motivating your work and not on technical details or conclusions. This mini preview presentation should be 1 (one) slide (maximum 2 (two) slides) and should only be 1 to 2 minutes in length. It is a **brief** advertisement for your work and we encourage **creativity** in your mini-presentation; **however time restraints will be strictly enforced!**

## Poster Guidelines

- All posters must be printed prior to arriving to the workshop.
- Poster dimensions should be kept within 4'x6' (height x width).
- If you are presenting on Monday, give your poster to Matt Thompson in the MBI office as soon as possible on Monday. Those presenting on Tuesday may give their posters to Matt on Monday or on Tuesday morning. (Double sided tape will be provided.)
